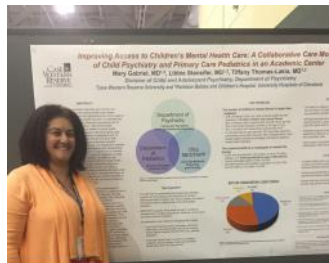

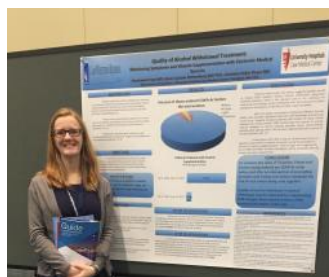

Awards and Recognition:

Dr. Danette Conklin received a Developmental Award to fund a "Midlife Wellness for Women Study." The Minority Faculty

Development Award is a three-year research award funded by University Hospitals of Cleveland. The purpose of this award is to support research and career development for minority, junior faculty who exhibit a commitment to a career in academic medicine and possess superior academic and clinical skills. The award stipend is for \$75,000. As a recipient of this award, Dr. Danette Conklin will be conducting an exploratory study for women transitioning through menopause, a natural but often challenging developmental milestone.

The general objective of Dr. Conklin's study is to advance insight into the impact of non-pharmacological treatments on the psychological health and wellbeing of women adapting to menopause. This exploratory study proposes to expand the knowledge in the menopausal literature, evaluating the effectiveness of cognitive behavioral group therapy by how well it reduces vasomotor symptoms and improves the mental health of menopausal women with mood and/or anxiety disorders. The study will begin to evaluate the role of race and ethnicity in regards to the effectiveness of non-pharmacological treatment. The study will also collect information regarding racial and ethnic differences in patients' beliefs about menopause transition.
